3604 IEC materials designed and printed and all are stickers in four languages of English, Kakwa, Arabic and Kiswahili on key protection and human rights messages on areas of harmful cultural practices, conflict and tension over the use of limited natural resources among the refugees and the host community, family negligence by house-hold heads, and children and youth in conflict with the law given to 873 right holders (277 male and 606 female) 28 duty barriers (25 males and 3 females) of which 6 are LC1 Chairpersons 4 health workers, 6 para-social workers, 6 VHTs and 5 CBOs (CERID, UMOJA, SUURA, CECI, and STAD) 901 (292 male and 609 female, 163 refugees 43 male and 120 female, 738 host 280 male and 458 female and 5 persons with disabilities were 2 males and 3 female) were reached by the IEC material on key protection an human rights messages.

- Translating the message to the different local languages was a problem because it was hard to get these translators and this was solved by contacting translators from spirit FM and Arua one FM to translate the messages.
- Delay of funds which has led to late implementation of the activity.
