1723 (1347 host 376 refugees, 534 males host 813 females, 125 males refugees 251 females, 659 total males and 1064 total females total, 5 females and 4 males with disabilities.) were reached during the health awareness campaign on public health promotion and disease prevention on diseases like HIV/AIDS, COVID-19, TB, Malaria, Typhoid, Mental health, and Ebola in the Cells Drimu, Isoko, Nyarilo, Lipa, Ombachi2, and Mondukudu in Koboko Municipality.

- The landlord in Drimu cell where the activity took place asked a question that for how long it will take for people to enter their houses after spraying under the government program to spray mosquitoes and the health workers were able to answer him that it will take only two hours for people to begin using their house.
- The LC1 Chairperson thanked CERID for this health program and said at least such programs should be every month to all the cells and requested the government through CERID and the hospital staff to introduce a vaccine for immunizing the people against Ebola since it has become a problem in the county.
- A young boy who's Name did not appear in the paper wrote a question and asked " if a boy played sex with infected girl slowly without the process of friction and also no meeting of blood will he get the disease of HIV/AIDS? " .
- My Name is Aate Mariam I have sugar diabetes and in all the health programs like this I don't hear people talk about sugar diabetes but is a disease that is also silently killing people what is the government doing about that? Mr. Jurua Charles the health worker at Koboko hospital answered her that sugar diabetes is not infectious unlike TB and HIV/AIDSs but sugar diabetes can be inherited from ground parents where in the family there are people affected with sugar diabetes.
